INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Chinabank Cash Fund intends to achieve a high level of liquidity and better earnings potential than those offered by regular savings deposit accounts and money market placements by investing in a diversified portfolio of deposits with a weighted average portfolio modified duration of not more than one (1) year. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is the Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond Index Money Market (BPHILMM Index).

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust, a copy of which is available at the Trustee's principal office.

The Chinabank Cash Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- have a conservative risk appetite;
- are looking for a cash parking facility offering acceptable returns; and
- have an investment horizon of one (1) year or less.



The BPHILMM Index is a systematically designed, rules-based, market value-weighted index that measures the performance of short-term, fixed-rate and zero-coupon local currency securities that are publicly issued by the Philippines. It includes liquid money market instruments such as treasury bills with maturities of less than 1 year and minimum par amounts of Php3.0Bn. This Index is adjusted for tax by the Trustee, but does not reflect deductions for fees and expenses. The benchmark provides a reference for evaluating the performance of highly liquid, peso-denominated money market instruments with a similar investment horizon to the Fund.


2Volatility measures the degree to which the Fund fluctuates vis-à-vis its average return over a period of time. This is computed by getting the standard deviation of the yearly returns for the past 12 mos.

³Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better. This is computed by dividing the excess return of the fund against the risk-free rate over the fund's volatility.

⁴Information Ratio measures the reward-to-risk efficiency of the portfolio relative to the benchmark. The higher the number, the higher the reward per unit of risk. This is computed by dividing the excess return of the fund against the benchmark over the fund's volatility.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper, amounting to Php415.18 million, which were approved by the Board of Directors/Trust Investment Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

In September, the peso yield curve bull steepened due to dovish moves by central banks amidst slowing inflation. On average, yields fell by 48 basis points (bps), with the short-end outperforming the rest of the curve. Short-end rates fell by 62 bps on average, with the 1-year rate down by 56 bps to fetch 5.5199%. Meanwhile, the belly went down by 48 bps on average, with the 5-year rate ending at 5.5709%, down 47 bps versus the previous month. The long-end underperformed but still rallied by 29 bps on average, as the 10-year rate fell by 33 bps to fetch 5.7381% at the end of the month. Amidst the bond market rally, trading volume for the month grew by 32% totaling Php1,367.280 billion versus the previous month. FXTNs accounted for majority or 45% of total trades amounting to Php612.640 billion, followed by Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) bills accounting for 23% or Php309.791 billion.

After more than a year of high policy rates, inflation has been on a downward trend. Headline inflation decreased to 3.3% in August, down from 4.4% in July and significantly lower than the 5.3% recorded in August 2023. This brought the average inflation for the year so far to 3.6%, which falls within the government's target range of 2-4%. The decline in overall inflation in August was largely driven by a slower rise in food and non-alcoholic beverage prices, which increased by 3.9%, down from 6.4% in July. Specifically, food inflation dropped to 4.2% from 6.7%, with rice inflation decreasing to 14.7% from 20.9% in July. Core inflation, which excludes certain food and energy items, also slowed, falling to 2.6% in August from 2.9% the previous month.

With inflation at manageable levels, the BSP announced a reduction of the reserve requirement ratios (RRR) for banks, effective October 25, 2024. The RRR for universal and commercial banks, and non-bank financial institutions with quasibanking functions, will drop by 250 basis points to 7%. Digital banks' RRR will decrease by 200 basis points to 4%, and thrift banks will see a 100 basis point reduction to 1%. Rural and cooperative banks will have their RRR reduced to 0%. This move is expected to release an estimated Php310-330 billion into the economy, increasing funds available for lending. The BSP remains optimistic about the inflation outlook and may consider additional RRR and policy rate cuts in the coming years.

Meanwhile, the local macroeconomic environment remains robust. In July 2024, cash remittances from overseas Filipino workers hit a seven-month high of USD3.085 billion, up 3.1% year-on-year, with land-based workers contributing a 3.6% rise and sea-based workers a 0.9% increase. Month-on-month, remittances grew 7%. For the first half of the year, remittances rose 2.9% to USD 19.332 billion, led by the US. Personal remittances also saw a 3.2% rise to USD3.428 billion in July, largely driven by longer-term contract workers. The BSP expects remittance growth to continue, despite potential economic challenges in host countries. Meanwhile, the country's budget deficit narrowed by 59% to Php 54.2 billion in August due to stronger revenues and slight spending cuts. From January to August, the deficit decreased by 5% to Php 697 billion.

In the local bond market, the Bureau of Treasury (BTr) held its weekly auctions of bills and bonds, offering a total of Php115 billion in bonds and Php105.2 billion in bills for September. All auctions were fully awarded, as rates for the bills fell by 77 bps versus end of August. Rates for the bond auctions, meanwhile, also declined by an average of 15 bps compared to previous auctions of the same tenor. Tenors for the bond auctions for September were for 3, 5, 10, and 20 years. Bid-to-cover ratio (BCR) for the bills averaged 3.53 times, up from August's 2.52 times BCR. For the bond auctions, BCR was relatively flat versus previous month, with September's average BCR at 2.23 times and last month's BCR of 2.22 times.

In the coming month, we expect the market to take its cue from key inflation and macroeconomic data, and the upcoming BTr auctions, which are scheduled to be of significant lower volume than previous quarters. The BSP Monetary Board is also expected to decide on the policy rate in October, wherein the market estimates a 25 bp cut.
