INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Chinabank Dollar Fixed Income Fund intends to achieve a steady stream of income by investing in a diversified portfolio of high-grade marketable securities comprised mainly of Philippine sovereign bonds as well as US treasury bonds of varying tenors with a weighted average portfolio modified duration of not more than ten (10) years. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is the Bloomberg EM USD Sovereign-Philippine Total Return Index.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust, a copy of which is available at the Trustee's principal office.

The Chinabank Dollar Fixed Income Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- have a moderate risk appetite;
- are willing to assume a certain level of risk in consideration for higher returns; and
- have an investment horizon of at least five (5) years.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

The client should not invest in this Fund if the client does not understand or is not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

- **Interest Rate Risk.** This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
- **Market/Price Risk.** This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in the market price of securities. It is the exposure to the uncertain market value of a portfolio due to price fluctuations.
- **Liquidity Risk.** This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the inability to sell or convert assets into cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a loss. These may be caused by different reasons such as trading in securities with small or few outstanding issues, absence of buyers, limited buy/sell activity or underdeveloped capital market.
- **Credit/Default Risk.** This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to a borrower's failure to pay principal and/or interest in a timely manner on instruments such as bonds, loans or other forms of security which the borrower issued. It also includes risk on a counterparty (a party the Trustee trades with) defaulting on a contract to deliver its obligation either in cash or securities.
- **Reinvestment Risk.** This is the possibility for an investor to have lower returns or earnings when maturing funds or the interest earnings of funds are reinvested.
- **Country Risk.** This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses arising from investments in securities issued by/in foreign countries due to political, economic and social structures of such countries. There are risks in foreign investments due to the possible internal and external conflicts, currency devaluations, foreign ownership limitations and tax increases of the foreign country which are difficult to predict but must be taken into account when making such investments.

The Trustee only transacts with reputable counterparties and invests in debt securities issued by countries and prime corporate borrowers which have undergone a rigorous accreditation and evaluation process. Regulatory exposure limits as well as the Fund's average duration are monitored regularly to ensure that exposures are managed. The Fund also employs risk management measures to monitor significant declines in the Fund's NAVPu and alert the Trustee to review current strategies and take corrective action as necessary. Furthermore, the Fund undergoes an annual review to ensure that it is equipped to fund any redemption requirement in a timely manner and at a reasonable cost during times of financial stress.

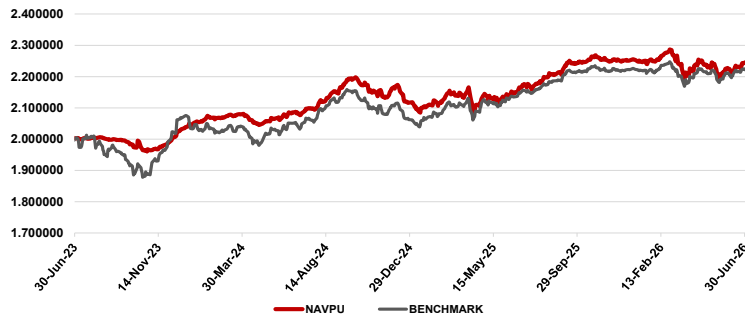

NAVPU GRAPH



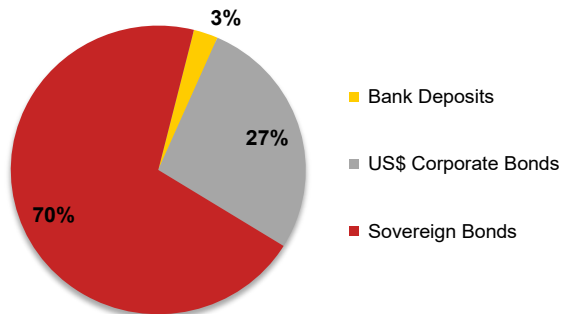

The Bloomberg EM USD Sovereign-Philippine Total Return Index is a market value-based, unhedged index that tracks the performance of Philippine sovereign bonds denominated in US Dollars, particularly ROP bonds of different maturities. This Index is adjusted for tax by the Trustee, but does not reflect deductions for fees and expenses. Additional information on the benchmark and/or its administrator can be found on Bloomberg, and be made available to investors upon request.

The benchmark provides a standard for evaluating the Fund's performance by helping investors/participants understand how the Fund is performing relative to the market or asset class the Fund represents. The benchmark reflects the performance of Philippine sovereign bonds denominated in US dollars, which are among the allowable investments of the Fund. Additionally, the benchmark's characteristics serve as a reference point for the Fund's duration and credit positioning.

²**Volatility** measures the degree to which the Fund fluctuates vis-à-vis its average return over a period of time. This is computed by getting the standard deviation of the yearly returns for the past 12 mos.

³**Sharpe Ratio** is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better. This is computed by dividing the excess return of the fund against the risk-free rate over the fund's volatility.

⁴**Information Ratio** measures the reward-to-risk efficiency of the portfolio relative to the benchmark. The higher the number, the higher the reward per unit of risk. This is computed by dividing the excess return of the fund against the benchmark over the fund's volatility.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper, amounting to USD193.77 thousand, which were approved by the Board of Directors/Trust Investment Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Oil prices declined significantly in June, with Brent front-month futures ending at US\$72.92 per barrel, almost back to the US\$72.48 per barrel level prior to the escalation of the Middle East conflict earlier this year. The decline followed the announcement of an interim peace agreement between the United States and Iran, under which both parties agreed to a ceasefire and a 60-day negotiation period. Despite occasional reports of renewed strikes, market sentiment improved as commercial traffic through the Strait of Hormuz gradually resumed. Since the announcement of the truce, an average of 23 commercial vessels have transited the critical waterway each day. While still well below the historical average of more than 100 daily transits, this marks a significant improvement from the near standstill seen before the ceasefire, easing concerns over further disruptions to global oil supply.

US Treasury yields bear flattened in June. The 2-year Treasury yield increased by 16 basis points to 4.173%, while the 10-year yield was broadly unchanged at 4.465%. As widely expected, the Federal Reserve kept its policy rate unchanged at 3.50%–3.75%. The Summary of Economic Projections showed that policymakers raised their 2026 inflation forecasts to 3.6% for headline inflation and 3.3% for core inflation, from 2.7% for both previously. The latest dot plot showed a divided committee, with nine officials expecting a rate hike by year-end, eight projecting no change, and one anticipating a rate cut. Chairman Kevin Warsh did not submit economic projections, consistent with his long-standing skepticism toward the use of forward guidance. Recent economic data reinforced the Federal Reserve's decision to remove its easing bias from the policy statement. Headline inflation accelerated to 4.2% in May, driven by a 23.5% increase in energy prices, while core inflation stood at 2.9%. Labor market conditions remained firm, with the unemployment rate unchanged at 4.3% and nonfarm payrolls increasing by 172,000, above market expectations of 80,000 and following an upwardly revised 179,000 gain in April.

Locally, Republic of the Philippines (ROP) bonds broadly tracked US Treasuries. The 2-year ROP yield increased by 13 basis points to 4.436%, while the 10-year yield eased by 2 basis points to 5.301%. Spreads over US Treasuries were broadly unchanged at 58 basis points. Domestic macroeconomic conditions remained mixed. Inflation eased to 6.8% in May from 7.2% in April, below both the BSP's 7.1%–7.9% forecast range and the market consensus of 7.8%, largely due to lower transport costs. However, rice inflation accelerated to 15.6%, while core inflation rose to 4.1%, its highest level in two years. On the policy front, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas raised its policy rate by 25 basis points to 4.75%, marking its second consecutive rate hike. In the primary market, the Bureau of the Treasury returned to the international capital markets with a triple-tranche US dollar bond offering consisting of 5.5-year, 10-year, and a tap of the 2051 global bonds. The transaction attracted strong demand, with the order book reaching 4.4x the initial target size and final pricing tightening from initial guidance. Total issuance reached US\$2.5 billion, consisting of US\$550 million of the 5.5-year tranche priced at US Treasuries +55 basis points, US\$1.65 billion of the 10-year tranche at US Treasuries +93.5 basis points, and US\$300 million from the 2051 tap at a yield of 5.85%. The offering follows the US\$2.75 billion triple-tranche global bond issuance completed in January 2026.

Looking ahead, market sentiment is expected to remain sensitive to developments in the ongoing U.S.-Iran negotiations over the next 60 days, as several key issues remain unresolved before a lasting peace agreement can be reached. Investors will also continue to monitor trends in inflation, employment, and economic growth, and their implications for interest rates. In this environment, the Fund remains neutral on duration and continues to be selective in its bond purchases, seeking to enhance portfolio yield.

INVESTMENT POLICY / PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The Fund may be invested or reinvested in the following:

- a) Securities issued by or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP);
- b) Tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision of a foreign country or any supranational entity;
- c) Tradable fixed income securities issued by private and public corporations which are listed and traded in an organized exchange/market such as bonds, notes and preferred shares which are classified as debt securities under appropriate accounting standards;
- d) Deposits and tradable money market instruments issued by local banks, including those of the Trustee's own bank, and foreign banks or their Philippine branches or any financial institution in any foreign country;
- e) Financial derivatives instruments solely for the purpose of hedging risk exposures of the existing investments of the Fund, provided that these are accounted for in accordance with existing BSP hedging guidelines as well as the Trustee's risk management and hedging policies duly approved by the Trust Investment Committee and disclosed to participants; and
- f) Such other tradable investment outlets/categories as the BSP may allow.
