INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Chinabank High Dividend Equity Fund intends to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing in a diversified portfolio of choice common and preferred equity issues listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange (PSE) which have a regular dividend payment policy and/or dividend payment track record. Up to 95% of the Fund may be invested in equity issues at any point in time while the balance shall be in tradable fixed income securities and bank deposits. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is 95% PSE Index (PSEi) + 5% Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond Index Money Market (BPHILMM Index).

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust, a copy of which is available at the Trustee's principal office.

The Chinabank Equity Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- have an aggressive risk appetite;
- are willing to accept higher risks involving volatility of returns and possible erosion of principal in return for capital appreciation and potentially better long-term results; and
- have an investment horizon of more than one (1) year.





The PSEi is a composite index that tracks the performance of the top 30 publicly listed companies in the Philippines based on market capitalization and is computed using a free-float, market capitalization-weighted methodology. It includes a diversified range of companies from various sectors of the economy including financials, property, industrials, services and holdings firms, among others.

The BPHILMM Index is a systematically designed, rules-based, market value-weighted index that measures the performance of short-term, fixed-rate and zero-coupon local currency securities that are publicly issued by the Philippines. It includes liquid money market instruments such as treasury bills with maturities of less than one year and minimum par amounts of Php3.0Bn.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper, amounting to Php803.67 thousand, which were approved by the Board of Directors/Trust Investment Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Global markets finished the year strong in December as participants increased bets that we have already seen peak interest rates. The MSCI All-Country Weighted Index, a broad measure of equity performance was up by +4.70% during the month. Meanwhile, the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Index, a barometer for fixed income performance was up by +4.16%. Markets cheered as inflation continue to soften, with November readings for the Philippines and U.S. coming in at 4.1% and 3.1%, respectively. Additionally, both the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) and the US Federal Reserve (Fed) kept policy rates on hold during their respective board meetings. More importantly, the Fed shared their updated dot plot for policy rates, showing that median projections of voting members call for a 75bps cut in 2024 and a 100bps cut in 2025. Meanwhile, the futures market continued to position for a more aggressive path of reduction in policy rates, pricing in nearly 158bps cut in 2024 alone, with the first move starting as early as March 2024.

The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) joined the "everything rally", adding +226.31pts or +3.64% to close at the 6450.04 level. In terms of sector performance, Services (+5.91%), Property (+4.84%), Industrials (+4.46%), Mining and Oil (+3.44%), and Holding Firms (+3.30%) pushed the market higher. Financials (-0.21%) meanwhile bucked the trend, declining for the month. In

terms of individual stock performance, AGI (+16.85%), ICT (+14.37%), JFC (+10.94%), MER (+10.83%), and AC (+10.42%) led the rally with double digit returns. On the other hand, ACEN (-8.75%), SMC (-5.46%), AEV (-4.70%), BDO (-1.58%), and WLCON (-1.18%) lagged. A rebalancing exercise on the FTSE index occurred during the month, with upweights seen on the likes of BLOOM, CNPF, and SMC providing added flows. Overall however, market activity was low due to holiday shortened trading weeks. On valuation, the PSEi closed the month trading at an 11.13x forward P/E on consensus estimates for 2024 earnings. This is equivalent to an earnings yield of 8.98%, which is on the cheaper end relative to bond yields. Recall that bond yields have already come off their highs, with the PH 10Y continuing to ease to 6.023% from 6.24%, while the US 10Y slid to 3.866% from 4.33%.

With the rally during the month, the PSEi's Q4 2023 performance stood at +2.04%, in line with the seasonally strong returns observed in past periods. Full year performance meanwhile was at -1.77%, marking the 4th consecutive year of negative returns for the local equities market. Nonetheless, finishing just shy of the previous year's closing level considering the number of headwinds in 2023 is no easy feat. Looking into the New Year, the index's Q1 performance have historically been more volatile. Macro data and Q4 report cards of PSEi members will start to come in as early as January, which will determine if the recent market excitement has room to run.

INVESTMENT POLICY / PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

- b) Securities issued by or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP);
- c) Tradable fixed income securities issued by private and public corporations which are listed and traded in an organized exchange/market such as bonds and notes;
- d) Deposits and tradable money market instruments issued by local banks, including those of the Trustee's own bank, and foreign banks or their Philippine branches or any financial institution in any foreign country;
- e) Financial derivatives instruments solely for the purpose of hedging risk exposures of the existing investments of the Fund, provided that these are accounted for in accordance with existing BSP hedging guidelines as well as the Trustee's risk management and hedging policies duly approved by the Trust Investment Committee and disclosed to participants; and
- f) Such other tradable investment outlets/categories as the BSP may allow.
